to our Baptism Renewal, page 10.





The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases His mercies never come to an end They are **new** every morning.










Holy Mass





Homily REV. FR. MIGUEL RAMIREZ

on the Gospel Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

Excerpts:

IT's good to be back. The last time I was here was pre-Pandemic or probably during the (Coronavirus Disease) Pandemic.

For those who are new at The Feast, I am Fr. Miguel "Migs" Ramirez. I am an 11-day-old priest. It's still very overwhelming, and it hasn't sunk in yet. I used to serve as preacher and Worship leader at the Feast PICC (Philippine International Convention Center). So, being here at The Feast feels familiar -- the faces, culture, and energy are so familiar. At the same time, it feels very new. We are in a new venue. I would have prayed that I would celebrate Mass in PICC.

It feels very new here because I'm not serving as a preacher or Worship leader. Who would have thought that I would be serving as your Mass presider?

It's a paradox of the familiar but very new.

That's what I want to share with you today. God's love is always very familiar, but it is always completely new.

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Familiar But New

The First Reading today from The book of *Joshua* tells the moment the Israelites are about to enter the Promised Land. They already defeated the walls of Jericho. Joshua is about to enter the Promised Land.*

Geographically speaking, biblical scholars would agree that that Promised Land is the same land where Abraham made a covenant with Yahweh. That was the same land where Abraham was a tent dweller or a squatter in that land. Some 600 years had passed after that time of Abraham.



For some 400 of those 600 years, the Israelites were living in Egypt. So, they did not know about this land anymore. The Israelites journeyed for 40 years in the desert only to return to that Promised Land -- not as tent dwellers but as land owners. It's beautiful --the familiar, but very new.

*Among the Israelites in Jerusalem, Abraham was the most faithful. So, God promised he would be the father of nations and give him an exclusive land for his clan. His son, Jacob, had 12 children, and among them, Jacob's favorite was Joseph who had God-given visionary dreams. One dream, which he told his brothers, was someday, they would bow down to him. They hated him and sold him to slavery in Egypt where he rose to power as governor. A severe drought hit Jerusalem so, Jacob and his sons fled to Egypt (Genesis 37). Years passed, after Joseph's death, the succeeding Pharoah, fearing the Israelites' growing numbers and potential power, enslaved them. Later, Moses led the Israelites out of Egypt. They wandered in the desert for 40 years and eventually reached Canaan, the Promised Land (Exodus).



First Reading: Joshua 5:9,10-12

9 The Lord said to Joshua, "Today I have removed the reproach of Egypt from you." 10 While the Israelites were encamped at Gilgal on the plains of Jericho, they celebrated the Passover on the evening of the fourteenth of the month. 11 On the day after the Passover they ate of the produce of the land in the form of unleavened cakes and parched grain. On that same day 12 after the Passover on which they ate of the produce of the land,

the manna ceased. No longer was there manna for the Israelites, who that year ate of the yield of the land of Canaan.



Grace Amid the Rock-Bottom

In the Second Reading -- the Letter of Paul to the Corinthians-- St. Paul says:

"Whoever is in Christ is a new creation."

Again, we know that Christ is the same Christ yesterday, today, and forever. It's very familiar but if we are in Christ, we are a new creation.

In the Gospel, we know the story of the Prodigal Son.

I preached about this also in The Feast. That's why, when I was making the Homily, I was stunned. What else can I say about the Prodigal Son? It's like what Bro. Bo Sanchez and The Feast Builders have said everything they could about the Prodigal Son. But the Holy Spirit works.

What drew my attention was this: "When the younger son was far away from his father, he was almost going to eat the food of the pigs but nobody gave him any. *Coming to his senses, he thought..."*

Just that: "Coming to his senses, he thought..."

Eventually, this would lead to the son's going back. Why did it catch my attention? Wasn't he very far away from God? Wasn't he in the darkness of sin? Wasn't he at the rock bottom of his life?

But look at this: Even in the darkness and in the rock bottom of life, he came to his senses.

What is that called? That is called *grace*. Even when we are in the overwhelming power of sin, grace can enter.

This caught my attention because who among us is perfect? No one-- not even myself. When I am at the rock bottom of sin, grace can still operate.

So, what was the son thinking when he said: "How many of my father's hired workers have more than enough food to eat? But here I am, dying from hunger."

He went back to the memory of his father, to the memory of the banquet in their house, and the memory of the good food in their house. Those were very familiar to him.

That's what I know what love is -- the very familiar.



Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:17-21

17 Brothers and sisters: Whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come. 18 And all this is from God, who has reconciled us to himself through Christ and given us the ministry of reconciliation, 19 namely, God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting their trespasses against them and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. 20 So we are ambassadors for Christ, as if God were appealing through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. 21 For our sake he made him to be sin who did not know sin, so that we might become the righteousness of God in him.



Challenge

Then, the son decided to go back and who made it new for him? It's the father who brought him the finest robe, the ring on his finger, and the sandals on his feet.

The familiar is always going to be there and God will renew us when we go back to the familiar. All of us are called to a life of repentance. All of us are called to a change of heart.

The challenge is to ask ourselves: "How far have we gone from God's love?" Maybe, some of you feel that you're far away already. Maybe some of you feel that you're like the older son who is righteous but still far away from God.

I want us to be reminded: When was the last time you really felt that familiar love of God?

For me, it was here at The Feast. It was deciding to become a priest. I thought I would have a family of my own. I thought that I would serve God here at The Feast as a Feast Builder. It all felt very good and successful. But when I discerned, the familiar came back to me -- my younger days as a lector, my days as a parish youth minister in our church in Mandaluyong, and my days when I would listen to people pour out their stories.

I said, "Lord, those are more familiar to me. So, I courageously stepped out of my comfort zone to go back to the familiar and by the grace of God, it led me to where I am today.

What is that familiar to you? Maybe God is leading you back. Maybe God is leading you to see that new thing that He is creating in your life, right?

So, we pray: "Father, Thank You for planting Your seed of love in our hearts. Many times, we go astray with sin and with dreams that are not our dreams. We go astray by filling in the expectations of other people. We go astray by the stresses and the troubles of life. But today, just like the prodigal son, we want to go back to what is familiar. We want to go back to Your love. May you renew us with Your love. Make us whole. Make us new. Amen.



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Talk





BRO. BO SANCHEZ:

You have a choice. You can live your life sitting on a rocking chair, sipping your tea on the porch, and watching life pass by-- not participating but just watching Netflix, KDrama, or what other people are doing.

The other choice is fighting battles with giants by holding a slingshot, getting hurt, getting wounded, and getting damaged.

You have a choice. What do you choose?

I've got good news and bad news for you.



Now, between this teacup and this slingshot, the noble part of me would rather die fighting giants for the people I love. Yes, there's this other part of me that likes the rocking chair. I do. As you get older, you want to slow down.

In my almost six decades of living, I want to thank God that He has pulled me out of that chair many times and God has told me: "No! You fight. You serve. You care!"

Do not cross your arms amid a suffering world and say: "I don't care. Let me sip my tea."

God says, "You care. You sacrifice. You suffer for the sake of other people. I call you."

I fight the giants inside me first -- the giants of selfishness, pride, sin, greed, and lust. I'm also fighting the poverty around me -- material poverty, spiritual desolation, and the suffering of the people around me. I fight that every single day. I'll get hurt and I will lose but it is okay because if God is with me in this battle, I already have won.

Big Message

Whatever battle you're facing, if God is with you, you have already won. I pray that you're receiving this in your spirit. If you're fighting a battle, my one big message is this:
The battle is the Lord's, and you're going to win because God is there in your midst.



We've been going through this series, *Joshua*, *Judges*, and *Samuel*. This is a group of people in search of a king. So far, the actors that we have been studying have not been great leaders, including the current one we're studying-King Saul. He was so disobedient and so proud that God had to reject him. Then, we receive this word: Samuel is sent to Jesse, who had a bunch of sons.

We're going to read this Word:

"How long will you mourn for Saul, since I have rejected him as king over Israel? Fill your horn with oil and be on your way; I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem. I have chosen one of his sons to be king."

"When they arrived, Samuel saw Eliab and thought,
"Surely the Lord's anointed stands here before the Lord."

This was probably the eldest of the sons of Jesse. What an impression!

Remember Saul last week? We studied that he was handsome. He was head and shoulders above everybody.

So, he was Chris Hemsworth, right? Eliab was probably like Jason Momoa of *Aquaman*.>

So, Samuel says, "This is it." But God says...



Thy Word is a Lamp unto my feet And a Light unto my path.



"Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The Lord does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart."

This reminds me of the way we elect politicians. We elect celebrities. I'm not against celebrities running for political office. Some have character and capacity but some are elected just because they're photogenic.

Look at the Heart

What God is telling us: Look deeper.

Singles, this also applies to you.

I was talking to a young woman and I asked her, "What are you looking for in a husband?"

I was expecting her to say: "I want someone who has a sense of responsibility and who treats his mom and his sisters with such respect because that's how he will treat me."

But she said, "I want a guy who looks really nice in a plain shirt, blue jeans, and black leather shoes."

I said, "Wow. That's deep. What if he's really cool, cute, dashing, drop-dead gorgeous serial killer?"

God says: "Look at the heart."

The biblical definition of *heart* is it includes *thoughts, feelings, will, motives,* and *moral character*. That's what God looks for in a leader. A leader whose heart is pure will serve without expecting anything in return.


Eliab was rejected. It was like an *American Idol* audition because all the sons paraded in front of Samuel-- but he was not the judge. He was just the host of the show. God was the judge. Every time a brother walks by and auditions, God says, "Nope, not this one... No, not this one... Not this one..."

"Are these all the sons you have?" "There is still the youngest,"
Jesse answered. "He is tending the sheep." Samuel said, "Send for him; we will not sit down until he arrives."

Jesse did not even think of David. Maybe he's too small. Maybe he's too thin. Maybe because he's a shepherd. During that time, being a shepherd was not a dream job. It required long hours and hard labor. It was hazardous to health to the point of death.

You don't want to be a shepherd. But David was one. Maybe, you feel like you're David. You're too ordinary. Let's pray: *Jesus, You brought me*

to this place for a Divine Purpose. Thank You for loving me and calling me to serve You. Speak to me. I will continue to fight giants inside and outside me as long as You are with me. In Jesus' Name. Amen.





The Incredible Giant

When David finally came, the Lord tells Samuel:

"Rise and anoint him; this is the one." So Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him in the presence of his brothers, and from that day on the Spirit of the Lord came powerfully upon David..."

David was anointed.

This is what happens right after:

"A champion named Goliath, who was from Gath, came out of the Philistine camp. His height was six cubits and a span. He had a bronze helmet on his head and wore a coat of scale armor of bronze weighing five thousand shekels; on his legs he wore bronze greaves, and a bronze javelin was slung on his back. His spear shaft was like a weaver's rod, and its iron point weighed six hundred shekels...."

In our measurement, Goliath would be 9 feet tall like the Incredible Hulk. Some 5,000 shekels is about 55 kilos, and that's just his coat of armor. Just the point of his spear is 6.5 kilos.

Not only was he Hulk but his armor was the Bronze Age equivalent of Iron Man's suit. So, think Hulk and Iron Man together.

There were two armies facing each other -- the Philistines and the Israelites.

Then Goliath breaks in and starts speaking to the army of Israel.

Goliath says:



"This day I defy the armies of Israel! Give me a man and let us fight each other.' On hearing the Philistine's words, Saul and all the Israelites were dismayed and terrified."

Goliath was like saying, "Hey, why do our armies fight each other? Many people will die. Just give me one man to fight with. Whoever wins this duel wins the entire battle."

Think about it. Who will volunteer to fight this Hulk-Iron Man guy? That's like going against Godzilla. It's like a death wish. It's like a suicide wish.

No Volunteers

Because there were no volunteers from the army of Israel, this is what happened...

"For forty days the Philistine came forward every morning and evening and took his stand."


Nobody wanted to fight. Is this not how our fears work? Every day, you overthink.

It comes and then you think about it. The next day, you think about it again. Do you know when it stops? When you face your Goliath. That's the only way. That's the only time the Goliath stops.

Fear stops when you face your giant. This mental loop will replay in your mind until you do one thing: face your fear. You have to face your fears now.

I preach this a lot. I always tell people to *Do It Afraid*. But I've got better advice. I added four very important words: *Do It Afraid with God Beside You*.

This was not the first time that the Israelites faced a giant. A few books before, in the Old Testament, in the book of *Numbers*, these people came from Egypt and as they were moving to the Promised Land, they sent 12 spies. Ten of them came back with a bad report.



"And the people are like giants. In fact, we saw the Nephilim who are the ancestors of the Anakim. They were so big that we felt as small as grasshoppers.".

Pictures are very powerful:

This image where the enemy is a giant and they see themselves as grasshoppers. Because of that, the Israelites did not enter the Promised Land. They got delayed. They walked in the wilderness for 40 years.



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David Volunteers

Let's go back to our story. For 40 days, Goliath was speaking. But no one stood up to him.

1 Samuel 17:14 says, "They all fled from him."

There was one guy who could have fought Goliath. It was King Saul. He was not only handsome. 1 Samuel 9:2 says, "He was head and shoulder taller than anyone else in the land."

Saul may not have been 9 feet tall, but he was pretty tall. All of the brothers of David were soldiers in the army. David was the shepherd boy. Do you know who volunteered to fight Goliath?



The errand boy.


Jesse tells David, "Bring this lunchbox to your brothers."

So, David goes to bring food to his brothers. Then he hears Goliath's challenge.

He goes to King Saul and says, "I'll fight him."

Of course, everybody says, "You're small."

David says:



David was like saying, "Yes, I'm a shepherd but do you know the work of shepherds? The lions and the bears are not vegetarians. They like lamb chops. When I see one of my sheep disappear from my flock and I see my sheep already in the jaws of a lion, I get my slingshot and my rock, and I go into a battle. I rescue my sheep. If God did it before, He's going to do it again."

A few Talks ago, we said this: "You've got to rewatch your God moments." David was recalling his God moments.



When you are in front of your enemy, and you are overthinking, and you are overwhelmed by your fears, think back to those moments when God rescued you and say: "If God did it in the past, He's going to do it again."

Just One Stone

What King Saul said was, "You really want to fight Goliath? Here's my armor."

The best armor of the land was the king's armor.

David wore it, and he said, "It doesn't fit.

It's too heavy."

He removed the armor of King Saul. David went as is where is.





David believed he needed only God's Presence:

1 Sam 17:45 NIV

"You come against me with sword and spear and javelin, but I come against you in the name of the Lord Almighty, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied."

1 Sam 17:47 NIV

"All those gathered here will know that it is not by sword or spear that the Lord saves; for the battle is the Lord's, and He will give all of you into our hands."

David uses one stone in his sling and it hits the target. Goliath falls.

All David needed was God's presence.

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You have been fighting battles, and right now, you don't want to fight anymore because you've given up. The one who gives up loses. Are you fighting your own selfishness? Are you fighting your own laziness? Are you fighting your own desires? You know they are not from the Lord, but you keep on falling. You keep on sinning. You keep on going astray.

God is telling you: "Keep fighting."

Some of you have certain projects that God wanted you to do. You've given up because they are too stressful. But it doesn't have to be stressful if you go and fight that battle with the Lord's Presence, depending not on your strength and not on your sword or spear but on the Presence of God in you. Keep on fighting because there is Someone in our midst who is greater.

Like David, Jesus was a nobody. He was so ordinary. He came from Nazareth. There were only about 40 families in that town.

There was a saying back then, "Hello? Who comes from Nazareth?"

Yet, God chose the lowliest to show His greatness in David and in Jesus. If you feel like you're the lowliest, you are a candidate to show the greatness of God. Like David, Jesus battled the giants of death, sin, greed, self-pity, and self-condemnation.

Like David, the shepherd boy, Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd, and I will lay down my life for my sheep."

Jn 10:11 NIV

"I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep."



Hold On to Your Slingshot

There was one thing that was different between David and Jesus. David was fighting physical enemies. Jesus was fighting spiritual enemies.

We are also fighting spiritual enemies. Unlike David, Jesus allowed His enemies to kill Him so that He could defeat them with His Resurrection.

Right now, some of you feel defeated. Let's face it. We lose some of our battles. I want you to turn to this One who is called "victor." He is the One who, at the end of the day, wins every battle. If He wins, you also win no matter what battle you're in right now: facing a lawsuit, drowning in debt, being in a broken relationship, fighting an addiction, and you're losing.

I heard the phrase "win-win situation" for the first time from my friend who had Stage 4 cancer. Somebody with Stage 4 cancer should be moping, weeping, and feeling depressed. My friend wasn't. He was jolly as ever. I could not understand it.

I asked him, "Why are you smiling?"

My friend said, "Because I'm in a win-win situation. I'm praying for healing. All my friends are praying for healing. If God heals me, He will be glorified, and I will live my life and serve Him. If He does not heal me and I go to Heaven-isn't that a win?

All of us are in a win-win situation. But this is the most important: You lose if you sit on the rocking chair. You lose if you stop fighting. You lose if you say, "I don't care anymore."

Stand from that rocking chair. Put aside that teacup. Hold on to your slingshot, the gift that God has given to you. You might win. You might lose for a while. But in the end, if God is with you, you will win. Whatever you're facing right now, in the end, you will win. You've got to believe in that. Keep on fighting. Keep on struggling. Keep on serving. Keep on caring.

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Renewal

Lift your hands and say this after me.

"Father, Thank You for the battle is Yours. This battle that I'm fighting, You own this. No matter what is happening now, I am in a win-win situation. No matter what happens, if You are with me, I have already won. In Jesus' Name. Amen."

I invite you to make Jesus stand beside you always, 24/7, for the rest of your life. That means you have to follow Him. That means He becomes the center of your life.

Let's renew our Baptismal promises. Put your hand over your chest. Say and mean every word: "Jesus, I will fight my battles as long as You are beside me. Win or lose today, I will win tomorrow. I Thank You that my life is Yours and You have chosen me."

When God looked at you, He said: "This is the one."

The same way He said to Samuel when David was in front of Him, God told Samuel: "This is the one."

In the same way, God is here right now. God looks at you and He's looking at all His angels. He's looking at His army, and He's saying :"This is the one. I'm choosing this one who will love me. This is the one who will serve me. This is the one I call to build My Kingdom in this world. This is the one who will fight the battles and defeat the giants. This is the one!"

The Battle is the Lord's. And if He is for us, who can be against us.


How many of you sometimes, if not all the time, have this fear of lacking resources. I agree with you. I share that sentiment.

Batang Quiapo is the story of Jesus Nazareno Dimaguiba (Coco Martin) apparently named after Quiapo's life-sized dark image of Jesus carrying the cross, venerated by devotees who relate their burdens to the Passion of Christ.

Just as those who need defense for their national causes find a place in Quiapo's Plaza Miranda, those who need a defender for their daily struggles have also found one in Quiapo —

in Jesus Nazareno Dimaguiba, better known as Tanggol, short for *Manananggol* -- yes, the Tagalog for *defender*.

To survive in Quiapo, Tanggol starts as a pickpocket, levels up as a big outlaw, and then becomes known as defender and savior of his hometown in Quiapo.

But at the outset, the first Tanggol has to defend is himself. And first, from his dark past, starting with his identity. His father is Ramon Montenegro (Christopher de Leon) who comes from a wealthy clan of crime lords.

Tanggol's mother is Olga Montenegro, also involved in the criminal world.

As the long story goes, Tanggol didn't know his parents. But as fate would have it, Tanggol crosses paths with Olga Montenegro during an encounter with common enemies.

"Could anything good come out of tragedy, one might ask. It could. And it did."

That's the declaration of Jesus Christ Cares For Cancer on its online page.

The statement continues: "JCCFC is born out of Reylindo "Rey" Ortega's heart-wrenching meeting with Brian, a 7-year-old boy who succumbed to cancer in July 2013. The young boy's passing disturbed him and made him more conscious of the plight of the poor afflicted with the illness.



"In May 2015, Bro. Rey himself was diagnosed with Stage 4 prostate cancer. With only six months to live, he resolved to spend his remaining days serving indigent cancer patients.

"JCCFC was officially registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission on September 28, 2015. Bro. Rey devoted more than 48 years of his life helping the poor before his passing in June 2017."

Bro. Rey founded several mercy ministries which are supported by Bro. Bo Sanchez and now sustained by our Light of Jesus Family and its spin off foundation, Shepherd's Voice Radio and Television (SVRTV) which helps sustain JCCFC's programs with monthly cash donations.



On June 30, 2017, Bro. Rey passed on, leaving the management of JCCFC in the very capable hands of Bro. Alo Gelano (*left*) as chairman.

JCCFC's monthly General Assembly connects its beneficiaries, personnel, volunteer servants with supporters and donors providing financial assistance for the medical expenses of the cancer patients.


Yes, as Quiapo finds a defender in Tanggol, the less fortunate, the sick, the dying find defenders in JCCFC volunteer officers

Google *Quiapo* and you'll find out it derives its name from *kiyapo*, or the water cabbage (*Pistia stratiotes*) abundant in the place.

According to MedicineNet, "Red cabbage contains the powerful antioxidant anthocyanin, the same compound that gives other red and purple fruits and vegetables their vibrant colors. In the lab, anthocyanins have been shown to slow cancer proliferation, kill already formed cancer cells, and stop the formation of tumor growths." (MedicineNet https://www.medicinenet.com > article)

Indeed, JCCFC is about the project of God through our Lord Jesus to embrace people hungry for material and spiritual nourishment with His unconditional love.
